

The Nemaha Central school board met at the high school for the October 9, 2017 meeting. Principal Ben Scism led members on a 45-minute tour of the building.

The FFA officers and sponsor, Bradley Goering, conducted a formal meeting in which they requested approval from the Board of Education for their Constitution and By-Laws. The board unanimously approved both documents for the organization.

Jon Thomas and Warren Seitz addressed the board regarding the need for an electronic timing system for the track program. The board approved the purchase of a FinishLynx EtherLynx Vision™ Timing System and RadioLynx electronic timing system at a cost of \$13,185. The board also approved the purchase two (2) new buses for \$172,982 to be funded through the Contingency Reserve fund and approved the trade-in of two 2008 buses.

Deb Kramer, guidance counselor at the high school, reviewed the ACT scores of those students who graduated in 2017. The average composite score for NC students was 23.2 and the state average composite score was 21.7.

New contracts were approved for Megan Green, Special Education para at NCEMS and Ginger Gudenkauf, Special Education para at Centralia.

No action was taken following an executive session to discuss employer-employee negotiations.
